### FHYA's Aims

- Promote and support research into the persistently neglected remote southern African past
  - Perceived absence of archival material for this period no archive in place but materials in:
    - Collections, that are often Undated...Misidentified...
       Dispersed...Difficult to access
    - Circulation in social life (E.g. clan praises and histories)
- Undertake digital archival curations and facilitate new engagements (not archival management and custody)





#### What is the FHYA?

- Conceptual intervention:
  - Releases materials from forms of colonial framing
  - Elicits further materials from diverse settings
  - Convenes them together in a refigured archive
- Technical intervention digital exemplars to enable refiguring:
  - AtoM option (500 Year Archive)
  - Low-resource archive option (EMANDULO)





# Why an Archival Framework?

Archives organised by respect des fonds:

 Makes clear how the materials concerned were assembled and deposited in preservatory institutional settings

#### In contrast:

- Museum collections classify items in terms of ethnic and/or cultural categories
- Herbaria classify items by taxa & species
- Private holdings idiosyncratic organisation






Why AtoM?


- Respect des fonds & RAD
- Could be used to keep a record of:
  - Shaping of materials over time
  - Previous taxonomies and preservation practices
- Brings materials together audio, texts, images, objects, botanical specimens, books etc.
- Institutional & technical support UCT & eResearch





# Limitations - organic growth

- Institutional materials
- Researcher's materials, e.g. field notes
- Living archive like clan histories and praises
- Non-repository based materials








### **Limitations – maximum searchability**

- Search across:
  - Institutional materials
  - Additional Resources
  - User inputs
- Highlight search terms
- Issues of search weighting

The podcast is based on accounts of life at uMgungundlovu given in their old age by four men who, in their youth, served at uMgungundlovu.


